SECTION VII – ELECTION OF EXECUTIVE OFFICERS

The PAC shall elect officers from the voting members for each school year.

Number and position of executive members should be determined by local organizational needs.

The executive officers shall be elected from the voting members at the Annual General Meeting, except that no employee/elected official of the school district or Ministry of Education shall hold an executive position.

1. Call for nominations shall be made at a meeting preceding the AGM.
2. In the event of a vacancy on the executive during the year the PAC shall elect a new officer who shall hold office until the next election.
3. Elections will be conducted as per PAC Policy.

SECTION VI – VOTING

1. The voting members present at any duly-called general meeting shall constitute a quorum.
2. Unless otherwise provided, questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a simple majority vote.
3. In the case of a tie vote, the motion will be lost.
4. Voting of members on all matters must be given personally; voting by proxy shall not be permitted.
5. Voting shall be done by a show of hands.
