• **Discussion about school drug awareness and support** — Our school has achieved a massive positive shift in the student suspensions (ie: fights/vapes, 100 suspensions a few years ago, only 3 this year). The no cell phone policy is helping to eliminate unnecessary meet ups in the hallway during class time. Having a hall pass gives the students more structure. Drug literacy and support is provided in a tier process and available to all students and families. A continuum is being created by one of our teachers and district staff member, to create a student generated curriculum. Ie: asking students what questions they have an providing staff the knowing and lessons to be able to help answer and educate. This curriculum will be built into the PhE health program.
